Sakai: Town of Iron Industries Travel Map

In the 16th century, shortly after guns arrived in Japan from Portugal, the production of guns began in Sakai. During the Edo period, many gunsmiths were active in Sakai and received orders for guns from daimyos all over Japan. The ironworking techniques in Sakai are still preserved today in the tradition of knife production. This map provides basic information on three facilities where you can learn about the gun industries and ironworking techniques in Sakai. Please make good use of the map when you visit Sakai City.

Sakai City Museum







Sakai City Museum is home to exhibitions occupying about 1,330 square meters of gallery space that introduce the ancient, medieval, premodern, and modern periods of the city's history. In the exhibition room, Large Keicho Period Matchlock Gun, the largest matchlock gun in the world, is on display.

Old Gunsmith Workshop and Residence







The Old Gunsmith Workshop and Residence began operating in the late 17th century and is only surviving gunsmith workshop and residence in Japan. Learn about the history of Sakai's guns with exhibits of matchlock guns and original archives, and content that lets you experience how gunsmiths worked. [Municipally Designated Cultural Properties]

Sakai Traditional Crafts Museum







The museum is a place for exhibiting, selling, and experiencing the traditional industries of Sakai City. The first floor sales area offers items such as kitchen knives, tenugui (cotton towels), incense, kelp products, and Japanese sweets. The second floor exhibition area showcases the history and manufacturing methods of traditional industries, including Sakai forged knives, Naniwa hand-dyed, Sakai incense, and more.


